

A VERY HAPPY NEW YEAR FROM FOALS 1. Welcome to all our new little friends. We are so excited to start the Year 2022. We are looking forward to all the new adventures, wonderful growth, and leaning experiences to come in the New Year. A fun activity that we will do is mirror play. Mirrors are a great learning tool, helping babies to explore and help their development. Babies love looking at their reflection and notice how they react. Do they try to touch the baby in the mirror or smile at them? We talk to them about who they are seeing and have fun making facial expressions, seeing their reaction, and building on language development.

SENSE OF FUN

We have some great art projects that we will explore. For January we will learn about Arctic animals and have fun playing with ice. As our sensory unit, we will talk about how the ice feels in our hands and watch the facial expressions of the babies. Also, for sensory, we will paint polar bears and feel the paint as we paint with it. We will dance to “Polar Bear, Polar Bear”, and read a story to our friends, “Little Polar Bear.”

Babies have fun learning through sensory by doing different activities such as playing with sensory balls. They will get to feel the different textures while we talk about the different shapes, sizes, and colors of the balls. We can play catch the balls, hide them, and stack them just to watch them tumble down. Just seeing the excitement of the babies as they move their hands and feet is so worth it.

COMMUNICATION

Communication is vital in any relationship, and as teachers, we would like to make sure we have all lines of communication open to you pertaining to your child. Please feel free to contact us with any question, concerns, or comments.

DEVELOPMENTAL DOMAINS

Each day we work on language development, social development, physical development, and cognitive development. While most people think we are just playing we are learning. Language skills are developed through reading and singing. Learning social skills includes responding to our smiles, laughter, and voices. Physical development skills are when they begin to push up when lying on their tummy, hold their head steady without support, roll over from tummy to back, begin to sit with support, rock back and forth, and sometimes crawl backwards before moving forward. Cognitive development occurs in an infant when he/she focuses on moving objects responding to his/her environment with facial expressions recognizing and reacting to familiar sounds and responding to the facial expressions of other people.

Babies get constant exercise by going through their regular daily routine. Each day, each baby spends tummy time on the mat to strengthen back and leg muscles. During feeding time, we practice putting their hands on the bottle to eventually learn to self-feed.

Once your child is 4 months old, he or she will get exercise time in the excersaucer. You will see that the hard work pays off as your baby builds muscle and gets mobile first by pushing and rolling and later by crawling, scooting, and walking.

FOALS 2

WE ARE BRINGING IN THE NEW YEAR IN FOALS 2, AND THERE IS A LOT OF LEARNING AND GROWING IN STORE OVER THE NEXT FEW MONTHS. We are excited your baby will be part of it. Maintaining your child's daily schedule is a big part of development in our classroom, and our teachers enhance the learning experience by including activities to support that development. Feelings are a key theme we will focus on in the coming months. And we all know that most babies have no problem expressing feelings. We sing songs about feelings – *If You are Happy and You Know It* and *How are You?* Reading books such as *Making Faces* and *Calm-Down Time* are fun activities we have in store to teach your baby about feelings.

In Foals 2 we go with the flow but also try to stick to our lesson plans. We encourage our parents to try some of our units at home as well. These become very fun, and it is a great feeling to see your child's intrigues with the activities. In our lesson plans we incorporate sensory activities; this helps with feeding as well. Language activities are also part of lesson plans, such as reading, singing, sign language and even other languages. The activities are endless, and it's always such a joy to your child show interest.

MOVING AND GROOVING

Big changes are always afoot in Foals 2, and one of the most common changes is your baby's mobility. Babies can go from limited mobility to almost running during their time in our class, and we aim to support and encourage every stage of their motor development. Please don't be discouraged if your child isn't walking yet and others are. We all grow at our own pace and have so much to learn.

While babies may progress at different rates, the following are some of the common milestones your baby may reach in Foals 2:

- Rolls over easily
- Sits leaning forward on hands, then unsupported
- Bounces when supported to stand
- Gets on hands and feet and rocks back and forth
- May creep, scoot, crawl
- Pulls up to a standing position
- Can sit back down from standing position
- Cruises or walks around holding onto furniture
- May stand next to furniture without holding on
- May walk holding on to your finger or hand
- May begin to take steps and walk on own

WELCOME TO A BRAND-NEW YEAR! We want to reassure you, that in these changing times, we are doing everything we can to keep our Colts safe. Our Colts are curious about EVERYTHING! They do a lot of tactile learning; therefore, we incorporate hands-on activities in our daily lesson plans. Our class loves to do art projects that involve family participation, so be prepared to do a project or two at home. Painting, chalk, and different painting utensils are just a few of items at our disposal.

The STEAM curriculum is a major part of our daily lessons. We do this in a variety of ways (i.e. sorting toys by size, counting blocks, etc...): flash cards, music and story time just to name a few. Daily, we work with our Colts on manners, sign language, and Spanish. They are little sponges. We are constantly talking with our class and asking questions (Can you show me where the musical instruments are? How many blocks can you carry? Donde esta la mastera? etc...)

REMINDERS

Now is the time for us to check your child's cubby hole for size and weather-appropriate clothing. Please remember to label all clothing with your child's name. We have numerous children that have the same brand and size of diapers; so, please be sure and label your child's diapers with his/her initials. (The fold of the diaper is an ideal spot to do this.) Please make sure to bring a **filled water bottle daily**. Our Colts love their water, and we will gladly refill bottles as needed.

Always remember that a child's work is play. This is how he/she learns the skills that are needed in life. We are here to help your child and you through these developmental years. If you have question, comments, or concerns, please don't hesitate to let us know. LEARNING TO GROW

This is a difficult age for your child. He/she is no longer baby who depend on you for everything, and yet he/she is not a pre-schooler who is very independent. This is the age where he/she starts to test boundaries. This is the age where "NO" is his/her favorite word. We start to focus on self-help skills (i.e., feeding himself/herself with a spoon or fork, washing hands with help, putting on shoes, taking off jackets, etc...)

One thing that we start focusing on is simple 2-3 steps directions. The main one involves diaper changing. We always explain to the children what we are doing (First we need to take off your old diaper and put a new one on. Second, when we are done, we pull up our pants. Last, we wash our hands) You would be amazed at how quickly the children latch onto new information.



HEAPS OF LEARNING

Happy New Year Pintos! With the new year upon us, we are in for some amazing learning projects. We've had quite a few changes in the Pinto classroom over the last few months but the most exciting is the addition of a science and sensory center. The children have had the best time exploring the bugs, seashells, ocean creatures and more! We included in the center some magnifying glasses and tweezers as well as safety goggles in preparation for several experiments coming up.

Things will be STEAMing up in the classroom this winter with a big focus on science and math. We will see the effects of what heat does to ice, make some snow, and even paint with ice cubes. We've added several math manipulatives that not only focus on counting but color sorting as well. Counting in the Pinto room is a daily focus as we count to our number of the week multiple times throughout the day, including counting to our number before we eat our meals.

During the month of February, we will have group discussions about diversity as this month is Black History month. We will hear about great leaders of our country and some of the wonderful things that they have done including many brilliant inventors. There are

many interesting discussions during Circle time as it is always a Pinto favorite time of day. It is amazing to hear some of the mature things these little minds come up with.

As we head into spring, we will put on our garden gloves and get back to work in our RHA learning garden. This is a great opportunity to not only learn about plants and flowers but learn about bugs and insects as well. We will be planting things such as tomatoes, bell peppers, watermelons, and our beloved sunflowers (always an RHA favorite.)

FUN TO COME

There will be lots of celebrating going on these upcoming months such as Week of the Young Child, a national holiday celebrating your Awesome Child and recognition for children in early learning, their parents and teachers. This is a weeklong event at our school with dress up days and celebrations.

During all these fun learning weeks, we will start assessments and parent-teacher conferences. We will discuss your child's progress during these meetings. This is an important time of year to see where we need to concentrate more to prepare students. Those scheduling a conference will receive a report card showing achievements, and we will discuss future goals. Please sign up!

I am thrilled to see the children learn and achieve things they didn't think they could do. Thank you for letting us be able to do something we love every day.

LEARNING ON THE HORIZON

Through our winter months we will explore arctic animals and where they live in cold temperatures, what they eat, and how their bodies stay warm. Then we will proceed to make a class "Arctic shadow box", which will include arctic animals colored and cut by the children. It's a fun way to start a conversation about what they have learned so far while putting together the box.

As the months continue, we will tackle diversity by using the "white and brown egg" experiment, that let children know that even when we look different on the outside, we are the same on the inside. Next, we will focus on health and body by eating healthful snacks, and the importance of practicing good hygiene such as brushing out teeth, washing our hands, bathing often, washing our hair and more. It's important at this age to teach health and nutrition. If we build good life habits now, they may follow the child through it. We will do the pepper and soap experiment to show the children how germs work and why is so important to wash our hands often.

Spring is one of my favorite seasons to teach because we learn about both the plant and animal life cycle through observing and exploring in our school garden. We will plant our own classroom flowers and watch a plant grow daily out of a bean seed. We will make charts to measure and log the daily growth of our plants and guess how many days will take to see the plant grow. We will do the "leaf experiment" by observing how liquids travel through leaves over a period of three days. As always, we will log what we see during those days.

MUSTANGS

HAPPY NEW YEAR FROM THE MUSTANGS CLASS! We can't wait to see what this new year will bring for us!

In just a short couple of months, Mustangs will say goodbye to the Pre-school class and Hello to the Pre-K class! The Mustangs will review lesson already presented to solidify that base knowledge for new concepts this spring and help push them over the edge and get them ready for this big transition!

ON REPEAT

The Mustang teachers have been making every effort to get our students more independent! One idea we have been stressing is putting their fitted sheets and blankets on our nap mats, putting on and taking off our jackets, reducing the reminders for potty breaks, and cleaning up after themselves after AM/PM snacks and lunchtime!

We have 6 sight words *Go, Up, No, Hi, We, and Me* right now. We are still working on increasing that number up to 10! We will continue to write in our handwriting journal and we are already seeing such a huge improvement! On top of that, we will extend our circle time. We will do this little by little over time, in preparation to help them sit for longer periods. We will boost our fine motor skills by doing pinch and grab exercises like button sorting with and lacing beads to help the Mustangs be able to hold pencils/ markers the suggested way.

Repetition is the glue of learning. Repeat. Repeat. Repeat. With each passing day, we get closer to our move-up date, and we want everyone in the Mustangs to be well-equipped!

SOCIAL & EMOTIONAL

Feelings and emotions can be tough to understand. We will hone our social and emotional skills by Using *The Way I Feel* by Janan Cain to help make a picture book of our feelings. Each book will be unique because it will be of our faces. We will laminate them and put them together to have them available so the children can use them when they need help identifying the right feeling words. The "feelings" faces can hang on the wall and change the expression on it when our feelings change.

We will continue to use and implement our behavior chart and behavior notes as we move forward in the year. We are in the process of adding in a sensory/cooling-off space in our room, a place for the children to go to let go of the anger or get away for a few minutes. This will not be a time-away area or a place for punishment but the complete opposite. It will have different sensory items to soothe or to calm and pillows or soft items to make it comfortable.

We can't wait to see how the children learn and grow over the next few months! Thank you for all your love and support!

We are excited to start the new year by learning more about winter, and making fake snow with two household ingredients. Want to try this at home? Here are the easy-to-follow steps!

FAKE SNOW:

1. Measure out 2 1/2 cups of baking soda into a large bowl.
2. Add in 1/2 cup of white conditioner
3. Mix it all up, and you have the best smelling & silky-smooth fake snow around!

Together, we will make the snow, with each student able to add in or mix the ingredients!

TROTTERS

HELLO TROTTER PARENTS! I hope you all had a great holiday season with a lot of love and family time. I cannot believe that it is a new school year, and now the remaining days will go by so quickly. We, as a class, have a lot to work on to get ready for the events that are to come such as parent/teacher conferences, Week of the Young Child, and Pre K graduation to name a few.

This upcoming month we will have conferences. Since your child has entered our room, we have been working on letter, number and shape recognition as well as letter sounds. We have also been learning about compound words, rhyming, and punctuation. During conferences, we will talk about what your child has learned, and this will be the time to ask any questions or voice concerns.

One topic we will be excited to learn about is insects. A fun activity we will do is go on a bug hunt. We will venture out in the playground to see if we can find any bugs and try our best to draw them. After we are done, we will make a bug book to share with others. Another

subject we will work on is problem-solving. The teacher will give the class a “What is missing?” problem, and they will try to figure it out. At the same time, the Trotters will learn about grids, columns, and rows. By doing this, we will see if the children can solve matrix problems through classification.

Another subject we will discuss later is other cultures and their traditions. The children will learn how people dress often comes from their culture or their family's way of life. We will also compare others' clothes and way of life to our own. As we learn about this, we will sneak in some math as well such as adding and subtracting beads and patterns. We will introduce the creative jewelry that many around the world wear. The class will explore the different textures, colors and patterns some might use to make jewelry. We will also have the opportunity to use our imagination and create our own unique piece of jewelry by creating a pattern and following the steps to put it together.

SELF REGULATION

At this wonderful age, self-regulation is something that we are teaching the children daily. Self-regulation is a skill kindergarteners need to allow them to listen, to wait, and to react calmly to things they don't want to hear. It's a skill that even we adults need to calm down and react calmly and peacefully.

There are many ways to help a child with self-regulation, but the one we have found that is more effective in class is teaching them breathing meditation. When a child does need help, we ask them to put a finger up and to pretend to blow out the candle. It does help a lot and distracts them from the initial problem. A couple things to keep in mind, give your child ample empathy and consistent praise for their efforts and progress. Your child will learn these skills gradually.

If you do want to learn more about the subject, I do have an article in the class that you are more than welcome to pick up. As we near the end of our school year, we will be getting ready for graduation and discussing moving up to the “big kid school” they talk so much about. We are so thankful and grateful that you have given us the opportunity to teach and spend time with your children every day. Thank you!

LEARNING DISPOSITIONS

I can't believe how fast this year has gone by. On that note, we have settled in. As the children go about their days playing and engaging in various activities, they continue to build their "learning dispositions" which, I believe, are crucial in a child's early years as they affect how students approach learning, and potentially the outcomes of later on.

Play and activities during these months were interwoven very well with "dispositional learning," and I see the children become enthusiastic when they initiate and engage in investigation, interactions, and play. For when children are curious, they explore, ask questions, and solve problems and can often demonstrate great commitment and persistence in focusing on a goal.

A SPRING IN OUR STEP

As spring approaches, there will be some egg-citing changes; eggs are important symbol of springtime. We will be learning this symbolism by introducing the major changes that occur during spring. The students will explore leaves and grass emerging and the shift in weather patterns.

We also will be learning about how special our planet is and how it requires our care. The students will learn how to protect and care for all living things by exploring concepts of recycling, reusing, and reducing use. Conservation is vital. We will use our outdoor time to look for animals, plants, and insects.

We will have a butterfly kit in our classroom, and we will learn how a caterpillar can transform into a beautiful butterfly by learning the life cycle.

I would like to encourage you to take your child on a walk and maybe even have breakfast outdoors to appreciate how magnificent this planet really is.
